THE BACKGROUND

- In April 2017 Auckland will host two of the largest orienteering events ever to be held in New Zealand.
- The Oceania Orienteering Championships and the Auckland World Masters Games will run over consecutive weekends in terrain throughout the region.
- AOC, CMOC and NWOC are collaborating to organise both orienteering carnivals
- 11 races in 14 days (including 2 days in Rotorua organised by OBOP).



Oceania and Middle Earth April 2017

Day & Date	Event	Location & Map	Map Preview
Friday 14 April	Oceania Sprint	Unitec Institute of Technology campus, eight minutes from central Auckland. The campus has a mix of urban buildings, parkland and even some bush to challenge all.	
Saturday 15 April	Oceania Long	Lake Ototo on the Woodhill Peninsula Complex, undulating to steep gully spur, with areas of very intricate contour detail. Approx. 1 hour north west of Auckland CBD.	
Sunday 16 April	Oceania Relay	Lake Kereta on the Woodhill Peninsula. A mix of pine forest and open farmland, all on a sand dune base.	
Monday 7 April	Oceania Middle	Pongarua Rd south of Auckland. Open farmland in limestone karst terrain. Features numerous valleys hemmed by large cliffs and boulder fields.	
Tuesday 18 April	Rest Day	Travel south to Rotorua via Matamata visiting Middle Earth on the way, or Otorohanga and the world renowned glow worm caves.	
Wednesday 19 April	Middle Earth Classic Length	A mixture of commercial exotic pine and "enchanted" forest. Within 1 hour of Rotorua, the thermal wonderland of New Zealand.	
Thursday 20 April	Middle Earth Sprint	Rotorua Lakefront CBD featuring the historic government buildings, mud pools and geysers.	
	ANZ Junior Test Match	Featuring Junior Teams from Australia and New Zealand. Restricted Entry.

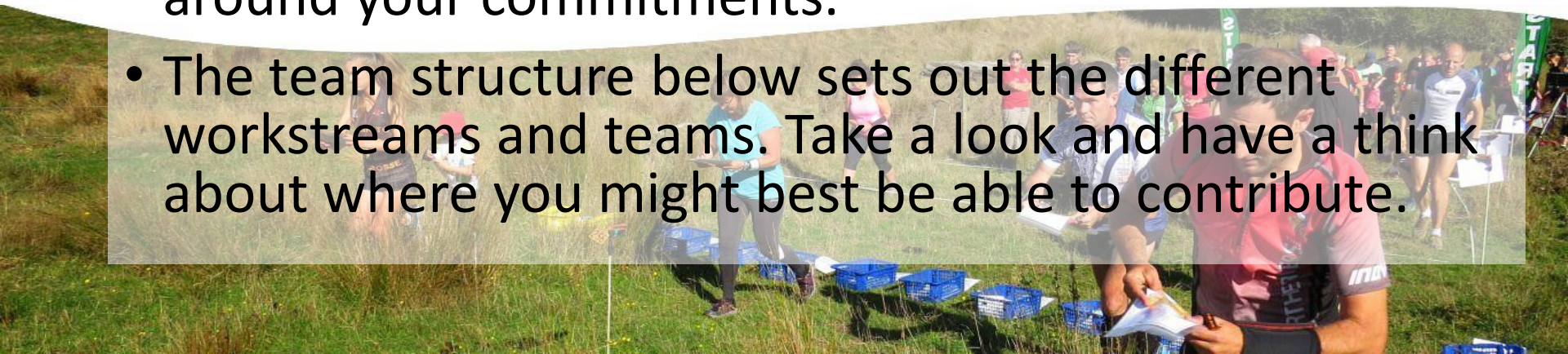

THE BACKGROUND

- We are hosting Oceania ourselves. This will be like a normal NZ orienteering event, only bigger.
- For Auckland World Masters Games, orienteering is just one of 28 sports. Expecting 25,000 athletes – that is bigger than the Olympics
- Target of 1000 orienteers for WMG and 600 for Oceania
- We will use the same teams to deliver both events. Volunteers will still be able to compete – we'll work around your commitments.

PLANNING THE LAST 3 QUARTERS

- We have been working towards the New Zealand Orienteering Carnival 2017 for over four years
- There are just three 90day time blocks left between now (June 2016) and then
 - July-August-September
 - October-November-December
 - January-February-March
- The OOC is scheduling deliverables into these three 90day blocks as follows



Each 90day timeblock has a specific theme

Marketing	Create and launch a social media storm	Personalise the message	Keep up the interest and train the athletes
Field of Play	Finish the maps and set the courses	Plan and test the field of play daily operations	Final countdown to map printing
Infrastructure	Define the needs and design the layouts	On board the teams and outside suppliers	Assemble the gear and activate the plan
Stakeholders	Set the relationships and confirm commitments	Nurture the relationships	Keep our partners informed to pre-empt friction
Volunteers	Activate our volunteer networks	Train the trainers	Schedule everyone's day and train them to succeed

OCEANIA VOLUNTEERS

- We are using a Mailchimp signup form to collect volunteers for Oceania and WMG but as per below you must also register on the official WMG site.



WMG VOLUNTEERS

- Compulsory volunteer registration process via the official AWMG website.
- Quick and easy process to sign up - about 10min!
- When registering with AWMG, you're just putting your name down. You won't be assigned to any particular role.
- When you get to the section asking for a sporting partner endorsed code use **ORIENSC**.
- The code allows you to skip many questions and the interview process.
- Still need to attend info session, photo and police check
